Biker Down involves a three hour course that is broken down into three modules delivered in partnership with **Devon & Somerset Fire & Rescue Service**



1. Scene Assessment & Dynamic Risk Assessment
2. Basic First Aid - covering catastrophic bleeding, CPR and helmet removal
3. The science behind being safe by being seen
